

Veteran's Day Fly In



The latest new addition at our field is the arrival of the wind sock replacement. Mark Lukens and Bruce Kuller collaborated to create a new and unique replacement for our worn out orange wind sock. The new wind vane is fashioned in the shape of a P-51D Mustang airplane. The body is .080" 6061-T6 aluminum sheet cut by hand on Mark's bandsaw. The vertical pivot blocks were machined and finished by Bruce as well as the prop shaft bearing block. Both sets of bearing blocks are machined out of aluminum bar stock. The 4-blade propeller is made from left over .080" sheet and hand twisted to provide optimal pitch for our wind speeds.



The plane was then hand painted with Testor's enamel to match a typical WWII paint scheme. After an initial test flight it was found that the wind vane lacked rudder authority and was tail heavy (we're all used to that). The wind vane was removed, 1½ pounds of lead was added to the nose (we're all used to that too) and the vertical bearing blocks were moved forward to the new balance point. The Man O' War was then taken out for another check ride and all seems to be working as planned. The wind vane is one of the first things you'll see upon turning the corner into our field and should be a welcoming and novel sight to our members and visitors for years to come.
